



Town of Seabrook Island State of Emergency

Dear Visitor:

The Town of Seabrook Island remains under a state of emergency due to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. To protect the health and safety of our residents and visitors, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Seabrook Island have implemented the following emergency measures:

GROUP CONGREGATIONS: Groups of more than 10 individuals are prohibited from gathering outside of a home or place of residence. Groups with more than 10 individuals will be ordered to disperse and may face penalties of up to \$500.00 per violation (plus court fees).

SOCIAL DISTANCING: Individuals and groups containing less than 10 people must maintain a minimum separation of 6 feet between persons who are not members of the same household. Violators may face penalties of up to \$500.00 per violation (plus court fees).

FACE COVERINGS: Effective July 1, 2020:



- A mask or face covering (such as a surgical mask, N-95 respirator, face shield, handmade mask, bandana or neck gaiter which covers the user's mouth and nose and effectively contains the expulsion of respiratory droplets when coughing, sneezing or talking) is **REQUIRED** in the following circumstances. Violators may face penalties of \$50.00 per violation (plus court fees):
 - Within any building (or portion of a building) of a business establishment that is open to the public or to customers of the establishment;
 - While waiting in line to enter a business establishment; and
 - For all employees while engaged in face-to-face interactions with customers.
 - *Exceptions: Persons unable to wear a face covering due to age, health or religious reasons; while consuming food and beverages; while smoking in a designated smoking area; children under the age of 5; while swimming or receiving dental services; or when directed by law enforcement.*

- A mask or face covering is **ENCOURAGED**, though not required, in the following circumstances:
 - While participating in gatherings of 10 or fewer people when social distancing is not being practiced;
 - While persons who are employees of a business establishment are within areas of the establishment NOT open to customers, but where interactions with others may occur;
 - While being transported in a vehicle with any person who is not a member of the same household; and
 - While using beach access points (designated as SIPOA Boardwalks 1-9) and associated wash stations.
