PUBLIC SAFETY TIPS

© A Christmas is fast approaching and with it all the Christmas parades! Keep an eye out for the parades happening in your area, and also keep safe as well so you and your whole family enjoy the fun, joyous floats! You may see the Charleston County Sheriff's Office Boat in a couple parades!

Here are some Christmas Parade safety tips:

- Have adequate supervision for all, especially kids. Keep them off the street and float path. Stay on the sidewalks or taped off/ marked areas for viewing.
- Plan ahead.
- Bring personal safety equipment. This may seem strange, but it is wise to have rain gear, comfortable shoes (for walking/standing), water bottle, sunblock, insect repellant, and a first aid kit, just in case.
- Watch the weather. Speaking of rain gear and sunblock, be sure to keep an eye on the weather, so you are adequately dressed and prepared for anything nature bring your way.
- o Follow applicable laws.
- Know and follow all parade rules and regulations
- $\circ\quad$ If you are participating in a parade, make sure you also take these safety tips into consideration.
- Have qualifies supervision for minors
- Consider physical fitness
- Use the buddy system, especially for minors
- Follow proper safety procedures, such as leaving adequate space between marchers and any vehicles, lookout for vehicles and other hazards, and take head counts before and after parade
- Secure a communication plan, especially for emergencies
- File any applications and permits for the parade

If you *See Something*, *Say Something*. Tell a first responder. Call 911 or call the non-emergency number at 843-743-7200. **IMPORTANT**: Teach your child how to call 911 in case of an emergency.
