



# A Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, the American Red Cross aids families in need every day across the United States and around the world; and

**WHEREAS**, here in the Lowcountry, families have relied on Red Cross of South Carolina volunteers for comfort and hope while coping with a pandemic, home fires, tornadoes, floods and storms. Last year alone, over 220 volunteers deployed to local disasters and helped more than 1,200 people affected by over 300 home fires in the Lowcountry, addressing their urgent needs for food, lodging and recovery support; and

**WHEREAS**, last year in the Lowcountry, the Red Cross collected more than 29,000 units of lifesaving blood and trained more than 7,000 people in lifesaving skills like First Aid and CPR; and

**WHEREAS**, in commemoration of the birth of Clara Barton, the founder of American Red Cross, the Month of March is dedicated to all those who continue to advance her noble legacy;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, John Gregg, on behalf of the Town Council and residents of the Town of Seabrook Island, do hereby proclaim March, 2021 as Red Cross Month in the Town of Seabrook Island, and further, recognize Red Cross Month as a special time to honor the kindness of our neighbors who continue the Red Cross humanitarian mission throughout the South Carolina Lowcountry.
